




Total AP Students 📕 Number of Exams




VHS AP Participation ELA & WL - Spring 2020 to Spring 2024




VHS AP Participation History - Spring 2020 to Spring 2024




VHS AP Participation Mathematics - Spring 2020 to Spring 2024




VHS AP Participation Science - Spring 2020 to Spring 2024



% Total AP Students with Scores 3+ (2020-2024)




Overall AP Average Scores (2020-2024)




Verona AP Score Distribution (2020-2024)




of AP Exams Administered by Course - Spring 2024



Average AP Test Score by Course - Spring 2024




% AP Exams with Score 3+ by Course - Spring 2024





2024 AP Scores 3+ or Higher





Average AP Computer Science Principles Scores (2020-2024)




Average AP Statistics Scores (2022-2024)

Average 2024 AP score increased **0.78 points** from 2023 & **1.25 points** from 2022





Average AP Physics C Scores (2021-2024)





Average AP Microeconomics (2019, 21, 23) & AP Macroeconomics (2020, 22, 24) Scores




Average AP Psychology Scores (2022-2024)

Average 2024 AP score increased 0.54 points from 2023 & 0.95 points from 2022




Average AP score of **3.53** over the last five years

Average AP Government & Politics Score (2020-2024)






Average AP World History Score (2020-24)














Sum of 3+ Outperformance

Sum of Predicted 4+ vs Sum of Actual 4+



New Jersey 2024 AP School Honor Roll Recognition

For a school to be recognized on the AP School Honor Roll, it must be located within the United States (including U.S. territories) or Canada and:

- Meet each of the following criteria anchored in research-based relationships between AP and college outcomes:
 - **College Culture:** 40% or more of graduating cohort took at least 1 AP Exam during high school.
 - **College Credit:** 25% or more of the graduating cohort scored a 3 or higher on at least 1 AP Exam during high school.
 - **College Optimization:** 2% or more of the graduating cohort took 5 or more AP Exams during high school. At least 1 of those exams was taken in 9th or 10th grade, so that students are spreading their AP experience across grades rather than feeling disproportionate pressure in any single year.

As of October 2024, in New Jersey

Of 498 qualifying schools, 38% earned a place on the 2024 AP School Honor Roll.¹


